






# **Unique Characteristics**

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

- 3. The Rapture is distinct from the Second Advent
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
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
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## John 14:1-4



## New Mystery Truth

"But here in John 14 the Lord gives a new and unique revelation; He speaks of something which no prophet had promised, or even could promise. Where is it written that this Messiah would come and instead of gathering His saints into an earthly Jerusalem, would take them to the Father's house, to the very place where He is? It is something new."





"The words or phrases are almost an exact parallel. They follow one another in both passages in exactly the same order. Only the righteous are dealt with in each case. There is not a single irregularity in the progression of words from first to last. Either column takes the believer from the troubles of earth to the glories of heaven."



"Hence it is impossible that one sentence or even one phrase can be alike in the two lists...And finally not one word in the two lists is used in the same relation or connection...It would be difficult if not impossible to find elsewhere any two important passages of Scripture that are so diverse in the words employed and so opposite in their implications. . . . We believe the comparison of the words of these two passages . . . describe different events."




# Catching Away of All Living Believers (1 Thess. 4:17)






- Harpazo = seized or caught up by force
- Harpazo (Greek) = rapere (Latin) = rapture (English)

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### RAPTURE DISTINCT FROM SECOND ADVENT


RAPTURE (1 Thess 4:13-17; 1 Cor 15:51-57)	SECOND COMING (Rev 19:11-16)
Christ comes in the air (1 Thess 4:16)	Christ comes to the earth (Zech 14:4)
For His saints (1 Thess 4:15-17)	With His saints (Rev 19:14)
Blessing (1 Thess 4:18)	Judgment (Rev 19:15)
Effects only believers (1 Thess 4:16)	Effects both believers and unbelievers (Rev 19:15)
Invisible (1 Thess 4:16)	Visible to all (Rev 1:7)
Announced only by an archangel (1 Thess 4:16)	Involves myriads of angels (Jude 14)
Resurrection (1 Cor 15: 51)	No resurrection
Rescue of the church (1 Thess 1:10)	Rescue of Israel (Matt 23:37-39)

### Matthew 23:37-39

"Jerusalem, Jerusalem, who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather [episynago] your children together, the way a hen gathers [episynagō] her chicks under her wings, and you were unwilling. <sup>38</sup> Behold, your house is being left to you desolate! 39 For I say to you, from now on you will not see Me until you say, 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of THE LORD!""




What the Bible Says About the Second Coming of Jesus (Lawrenceville, GA: Armor Books, 2003), 171.

"I could never reconcile the conflicting statements—that there should be seven years of tribulation and the reign of Antichrist before the coming of Christ, and yet it could happen 'tonight.' What these teachers should have said was that the rapture and the Second Advent were two distinct, unrelated events, and that whereas the rapture could take place 'tonight,' the Second Advent could not take place until after the Tribulation and the last seven years of this age which would include the reign of Antichrist."

What the Bible Says About the Second Coming of Jesus (Lawrenceville, GA: Armor Books, 2003), 171.

"It is still truth to teach that the rapture could take place at any moment. The Second Advent, however, cannot take place until after the Tribulation and the reign of Antichrist. In fact, all the prophecies of Mt. 24–25; Mk. 13; Lk. 21:1-11, 25-33; 2 Thess. 2; 1 Thess. 5; Rev. 4:1–19:10 must be fulfilled in detail before the Second Advent of Christ and after the rapture."

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

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### Revelation 20:4-6

...<sup>5</sup> The rest of the dead did not come to life [zaō] until the thousand years were completed. This is the first resurrection [anastasis]. <sup>6</sup> Blessed and holy is the one who has a part in the first resurrection [anastasis]; over these the second death has no power, but they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with Him for a thousand years."





#### **Imminent**



(1 Cor 15:51; 1 Thess 4:15)

- Imminency definition
- James 5:8; 1 Thess 1:10; 1 Cor 1:7; Philip 3:20
- We are to be looking for Jesus Christ and not the Antichrist!
- Motivator (Holiness, Evangelism)
- Feast of Trumpets?



#### Wayne Brindle

"Biblical Evidence for the Imminence of the Rapture," *Bibliotheca Sacra* 158, no. 630 (April-June 2001): 138-51.

"Four criteria may be suggested, any one of which indicates imminence:

- (1) The passage speaks of Christ's return as at any moment.
- (2) The passage speaks of Christ's return as 'near,' without stating any signs that must precede His coming.
- (3) The passage speaks of Christ's return as something that gives believers hope and encouragement, without indicating that these believers will suffer tribulation.
- (4) The passage speaks of Christ's return as giving hope without relating it to God's judgment of unbelievers."






#### Comfort



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
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By way of parody, Dr. Barnhouse also pointed out that if the midtrib or posttrib advocates sang this song, it would instead have to say:

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#### 1 Thessalonians 1:10

"and to wait for His Son from heaven, whom He raised from the dead, that is Jesus, who <u>rescues (rhyomai)</u> us <u>from (ek)</u> the wrath (orgē) to come.."



#### Promised Exemption from Divine Wrath

The promise (1 Thess 1:10; 5:9; Rom 5:9; 8:1; Rev 3:10)

Tribulation = divine wrath/anger (Rev 6:16-17; 11:18; 14:10; 15:1, 7; 16:1, 19; 19:15)



### 1<sup>st</sup> Six Seals (Revelation 6)

**SEAL 1** – 6:1-2 – Advent of antichrist

**SEAL 2** – 6:3-4 – War


**SEAL 3** – 6:5-6 – Famine

**SEAL 6** – 6:12-17 – Cosmic disturbances


