Lesson 6 - Wrong Ways to Master the Flesh

Colossians 2:16-23

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Therefore ... (Col 2:16)

- In Christ the fullness of deity dwells bodily, and believers partake of the fullness because they are in Him (Col 2:9-10).
- You were also circumcised with a circumcision made without hands, in the removal of the body of the flesh (Col 2:11).
- You were buried with Him in baptism, in which you were also raised up with Him. He made you alive together with Him (Col 2:12-13).
- *Wrong* ways to master the fleshly nature:
 - 1. "self-made religion" (Col 2:16-17)
 - 2. "self-abasement" (Col 2:18-19)
 - 3. "severe treatment of the body" (Col 2:20-22)



Legalistic rules and rituals

Colossians 2:16-17

- **Stop passing judgment** ~ stop using these rules & rituals in an attempt to gain spirituality or to measure your spirituality.
- Dietary regulations and ritual observances = *traditions of men*.
- **Self-made religion** = Restrictions beyond what is revealed in the Word of God.
- Follow these things or don't follow them ~ it matters not. Adhering to behavioral checklists gains no favor with God.
- **Christ is the reality** ~ stop focusing on His shadow.



Mystical experiences and visions

Colossians 2:18-19

- Stop declaring others unworthy.
- Angelic spirit beings are **never** to be worshipped.
- Ecstatic experiences and mystical visions are subjective and impossible to verify ~ focus on the objective truths of God's Word.
- False humility can be a cover for great pride and arrogance.
- **Remain connected to Christ** ~ He is head of His body, the Church. He is our only source of life, nourishment, and growth.
- Human mind + sin nature = dangerous error (Anticipates what Paul will say about a godly mindset)



Ascetic restrictions and regulations

Colossians 2:20-22

- **Since you have died with Christ** ~ *Baptism* pictures death to the sinful flesh, and a believer's new life in Christ (Col 2:12-13).
- Abstaining from things that can be handled, tasted, and touched ~ Your spirituality or continued relationship with God does not depend on avoiding specific consumables, which have no permanent existence and no significance in themselves.
- Man-made teachings ~ restrictions without divine authority. They are "in accordance with man's commandments" but not in accordance with God's Word.



Wrong ways to master the fleshly nature

- 1. **Legalism**: "self-made religion" (Col 2:16-17)
- 2. **Mysticism**: "self-abasement" (Col 2:18-19)
- 3. **Asceticism**: "severe treatment of the body" (Col 2:20-22)
- These matters can have the **appearance of wisdom**.
- None can provide any power for **mastering the sin nature**.
- Only our focus on Christ and our vital connection with Him can provide the desire and power to live a life that pleases Him.
